All Members are legally and personally responsible for THEIR actions and the BCMSA will NOT be held responsible if those actions are not in compliance of the Canadian Firearms Act and/or the direction of the Chief Firearm Officer. Ignorance of the Laws and rules is not an excuse.



BCMSA Arena Approval Process

- Arena operators/users must submit the following to the BCMSA Secretary
 P.O. Box 1905, Unity, SK. SOK4L0:
 - Restricted PAL # and photocopy of both sides.
 - Proof of a Valid BCMSA membership and AEF or SHF membership.
 - Completed BCMSA Arena Certification form.
 - Unless inspected by a BCMSA board member, photographs and /or videos of the facility.
 - The BCMSA Board will then approve or deny the arena.

Renewing your BCMSA membership will automatically renew your certification. Allowing your BCMSA membership to expire will automatically cancel your arena certifications.

BCMSA Arena Operator

Rules Overview

All Participants are required to adhere to the Canadian Firearms Act

Category	Precautions
Firearm	You MUST have your ATT, PAL and BCMSA card. Adhere to all firearm
Transportation	transportation and safety laws.
	Firearms that are not in use need to be locked up and stored safely out of
	sight (truck, trailer, or trunk of car).
	Never transport live ammunition to a mounted shooting clinic, event,
	practice or demonstration.
	Only black powder blanks with no projectiles are permitted at a mounted
	shooting event, practice, or demonstration.
Firearm Handling	Keep your firearms holstered or locked up.
	Do NOT cock (pull hammer back or lever) until immediately prior to
	engaging the target.
	Control the direction of the muzzle at all times. Do NOT point the muzzle
	towards a person or animal.
	Load and inspect your firearm with the muzzle pointing towards the
	ground or a wall.
	YOU are 100% responsible for your firearms.
	Dropped firearms should only be picked up by the owner, or a qualified
	individual with the permission of the owner.
	Balloon setters and volunteers that do NOT possess a restricted PAL
	should never touch a firearm.
	Spectators should NEVER touch a firearm.
	Do NOT "fan the crowd" with your firearm. Keep it pointed down and
	away from spectators or on target at all times.
Loading Firearms	Load and unload firearms in designated (Armourer table) areas.
	Load revolvers with five blanks with the firing pin resting on the empty
	chamber.
	Only load five rounds in rifle. Do NOT chamber a blank until immediately
	prior to engaging a target.
	> Do NOT discharge a misfire or un-shot blanks. Only shoot at targets during
	your stage. Never shoot before or after crossing the timer line.



Arena Safety	All shooters must sign in and out of the ranges including their full name,

	If practicing without an official, announce your run (Fire in the hole!) and
	do not start shooting until you see that everyone has control of their
	horses and that the arena is safe.
	Do NOT begin a stage until all people (balloon setters etc.) are clear of the
	arena.
	Wait for permission to start your run. When in doubt, do NOT run until
	you feel it is safe to do so. You might see something the official does not.
	All targets MUST be 34 feet from the rail where spectators are present.
	Keep the entry and exit (gate) area clear of riders, horses and spectators.
	Always clean up after both you and your horse.
Horse Safety	Horses must be in a general healthy condition.
	Farrier work should be up to date.
	Earplugs for your horse are highly recommended.
	Tack must be in good working condition.
	Horses must be under control at all times. Disobedient or dangerous
	horses should be removed from the practice or competition.
	If your horse has bad behavioral issues (kicks, bites, cycling mare or stud)
	you must let everyone know.
Rider Safety	Absolutely NO drinking of alcohol before or during a shoot, practice or
	demonstration.
	NO drugs that may affect your judgement or reaction time before or
	during the shoot should be taken.
	No abusive or threatening behaviour or language is allowed.
	Earplugs for shooters and spectators are recommended.
	Safety glasses are recommended when shooting.
	Anyone under the age of 18 (wrangler) MUST wear a helmet.
	No participant under 18 (wrangler) shall fire ANY firearm while on
	horseback at any BCMSA event including a practice, jackpot, clinic and competition.
	 Conduct yourself with professionalism and a sportsman like conduct
	before, during and after any mounted shooting event.
